AUGUST 8 PICNIC WILL BE HELD AT MALVERN. . . The picnic this coming Saturday will be held at the Hot Spring County Industrial Park on the west side of Malvern. This site was decided upon because it has more shade trees and fewer chiggers and ticks than Butterfield. To get there just turn off I-30 onto My. 270 and go toward Malvern. The park is on the left (north) side of the highway. It is easy to find, just look for a locomotive and caboose as you cross the railroad. (These directions are gaaranteed accurate, sorry about our last ones.)

Starting time for the picnic is 10:00 a.m. This is a do-it-ourselves affair, so if you signed up to bring food, please get it there. The Grigsby Collection's former Louisiana Long Leaf Lumber #7, a 2-6-2 woodburner, will be on display at the park along with an ex-Rock Island caboose. Later, those who wish may drive out to Butterfield to inspect the two newly arrived locomotives, W. T. Carter & Brother #2, 2-6-0; and #4, 2-6-2; both oil-burners. This will give a good example of restored and unrestored motive power. Current plans are to give these two engines a more sedate paint job than #7, although the #7 is apparently painted much as it was when new.
